John Pilgrim lectured at Edinburgh in the Department of Social Anthropology and on secondment to Njala University College, University of Sierra Leone, for six years in the 'sixties, and then jointed UNESCO as Adviser in the setting up of Chulalongkorn University Social Science Research Institute and UNICEF as Adviser to the MRC.

Very much an applied anthropologist, working on agrarian development in Africa, small farmer credit and technology in Pakistan, and then, for the past ten years, on land losses and resettlement in Cambodia, he joined the Royal University of Phnom Penh as a Visiting Professor in January 2007, having acted as a member of their Heinrich Boll research programme committee and graduate programme in development studies.

With colleagues at RUPP he has developed a research programme, funded by IDRC, on migration, rural poverty and community natural resource management, now under way in Battambang, Kampong Thom, Takeo and Prey Veng.
